To do our best as a hospital, optimal care is always front and center, and 2007 marked a year of exceptional achievements. Being recognized for our excellence is always an honor for caregivers, but the real reward is the day-to-day interaction with the thousands of patients, families and visitors we serve.

Overlake received national recognition in 2007 from HealthGrades, which analyzed patient outcomes for virtually all 5,000 hospitals across the country. The 2007 HealthGrades study found patient outcomes at Overlake among the nation's best for vascular services, heart failure treatment, valve replacement and stroke care services; joint replacement, total knee replacement, spinal, neck and back, and bariatric (weight-loss) surgeries; and women's health and maternity care. In all, Overlake received 11 five-star HealthGrades designations, and was the only hospital in Washington state to receive a five-star rating for both women's health and maternity care. In addition to the HealthGrades designations, Overlake was recognized for quality care by the American Association of Critical Care Nurses, Premera Blue Cross, the American College of Radiology, the American Stroke Association and several other organizations.

High-Quality Care for Patients with Heart Conditions and Surgical Needs

THERE IS NO SUCH THING AS A ROUTINE HEART PROCEDURE OR SURGERY FOR YOU OR A LOVED ONE. THESE ARE IMPORTANT AND SERIOUS EVENTS, FOR WHICH THE BEST MINDS AND BEST TECHNOLOGY ARE PARAMOUNT. IN 2007 OVERLAKE WAS RECOGNIZED BY HEALTHGRADES FOR EXCELLENCE IN A BROAD RANGE OF CARDIAC AND SURGICAL SERVICES, RANGING FROM HEART FAILURE CARE TO JOINT REPLACEMENT SURGERY. OVERLAKE'S OUTSTANDING CARDIAC SERVICES WERE FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGED BY PREMIER BLUE CROSS, WHICH DESIGNATED OVERLAKE A BLUE DISTINCTION CENTER FOR CARDIAC CARE.

CARING FOR CARDIAC PATIENTS Overlake offers a full range of cardiac services, from prevention to interventional procedures and open heart surgery. In 2007 Overlake opened a new inpatient unit in the South Tower to care for medical and surgical cardiac patients, and critical care patients who require cardiac monitoring. A host of interventional cardiovascular services – as well as the Eastside's only open heart surgery program – offer life-saving care for patients, close to home. Record-breaking “door-to-balloon” times this year put Overlake in the lead in Washington state. This measurement calculates the amount of time it takes to deliver rapid, heart-saving cardiac care from the moment a patient comes through the door of our Emergency & Trauma Center. HealthGrades gave Overlake a five-star designation for heart failure treatment, and designated Overlake's cardiac surgery program the best in the Seattle area.

CARING FOR SURGICAL PATIENTS Surgical expertise at Overlake is comprehensive, including general and specialty procedures. Joint replacement surgeries for hips and knees make up a banner program, and in 2007 the hospital received a five-star designation from HealthGrades for these services. Overlake also received five stars for bariatric (weight-loss) surgery and surgery of the spine, back and neck. For patients undergoing one of these procedures, there is added reassurance and confidence that Overlake has a track record for superior clinical outcomes.

CARING FOR CANCER PATIENTS Cancer care is continually evolving as new treatments are researched and developed. Overlake's cancer care team includes oncologists, surgeons, radiologists and a talented support staff of medical professionals whose life work is cancer treatment and healing. Team members, working with patients, develop treatment plans tailored to each patient's needs based on the latest research and approved therapies. In 2007 the American College of Radiology (ACR) named Overlake a Breast Imaging Center of Excellence, a designation given to breast imaging centers that achieve excellence by seeking and earning accreditation in all of the ACR's breast-imaging accreditation programs and modules.

CARING IN A CRISIS Compassion, skilled care and speed are hallmarks of quality care in Overlake's new Emergency & Trauma Center. Opened in the fall of 2007, this busy unit is a regional safety net, offering special expertise in stroke and heart attack care. Technology helps healthcare providers work smarter and faster, with digital scheduling programs and electronic medical records deployed to support more rapid diagnoses, reports and coordination of care. The unit is the only Level III trauma center on the Eastside. In the event of a regional disaster it will serve as the backup emergency responder to Harborview Medical Center.

CARING FOR EXPECTING MOTHERS For women who are expecting babies, Overlake offers a premier Childbirth Center, staffed with caring and skilled physicians, midwives and nurses who are trained in state-of-the-art procedures and always mindful of respecting mothers' wishes for the childbirth experience. Because quality healthcare means being equipped and ready for the full range of patient needs, our smallest and most vulnerable patients – low birth-weight and fragile infants – are cared for in a Level II neonatal intensive care unit. Our Women's Clinics, conveniently located in Bellevue and Issaquah, give new mothers the care they need with postpartum follow-up appointments, and lactation education and support. Overlake's maternity care program ranks in the top 10 percent of all maternity care programs in the country, according to HealthGrades.

CARING FOR WOMEN IN MID-LIFE AND BEYOND We offer high-quality care to women in all stages of their lives. Overlake's Bellevue and Issaquah Breast Centers offer state-of-the-art digital mammography. In 2007 more than 20,000 women received mammograms at these facilities, and the numbers continue to grow, confirming the hospital's vital role in breast cancer prevention. In addition to mammography, Overlake offers women in mid- to later-life bone density scans, heart care and a full spectrum of specialty services. As with the maternity care program, our women's health program rates among the top 10 percent of women's health programs in the country, according to HealthGrades.







OUR SENIOR CARE AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROGRAMS AND OUR NETWORK OF SPECIALTY AND PRIMARY CARE CLINICS ARE SERVING EVER-GROWING PATIENT POPULATIONS.

CARING FOR OLDER ADULTS As men and women grow older, quality medicine focuses on the unique needs and opportunities of this phase of life, ranging from treating their special healthcare requirements to providing education and care coordination. The over-80 demographic is the fastest growing population segment on the Eastside. Senior Care is an award-winning, multi-faceted program that mobilizes an array of services, including two freestanding senior clinics, educational events, special hospital programs and support for caregivers.

CARING FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS Children, teenagers and adults struggling with mental health issues can get help and hope from Overlake's highly regarded Behavioral Health program, which offers a wide range of services based on individual needs. A 14-bed voluntary inpatient adult and adolescent facility provides a multidisciplinary team to care for patients in need of intensive care. A day program option is available for teens and adults, and provides cognitive-behavioral treatment, education, therapy and medication management. Overlake's Specialty School is an off-site academic school for children and adolescents who are unable to function safely in their existing schools because of behavioral issues, offering a second chance to many troubled lives. After a time of intensive academic and behavioral support, most of the Specialty School students successfully make the transition back to their original schools.

CARING FOR THE COMMUNITY A large portion of our region's growth is centered in the Issaquah and Sammamish communities. Superb and convenient medicine is available in this area through a network of specialty and primary care physician clinics. The Breast Center and Women's Clinic opened in 2003, and the Anticoagulation Clinic and Urgent Care Clinic opened in 2005. The Anticoagulation Clinic is for patients on blood-thinning medications who require close and frequent monitoring. The 24-hour Issaquah Urgent Care Clinic specializes in treating non-life-threatening conditions. In 2007 increasing numbers of Eastsiders turned to the clinic for faster, less-expensive care than is offered in a typical emergency room visit.
